- •Trends assessed for men and women between 1992-2006







Men, 1992-2006

























Silicosis Incidence

Men, 1995-2006


















Burden of Pneumoconioses in BC










Incidence of Asbestos, CWP, and Silicosis

*predicted rate; per 100,000








Incidence of Asbestos, CWP, and Silicosis

Conclusions

- •The decreasing rates of silicosis and CWP are consistent with the decreasing prevalence of high exposures over time;
- •The increasing rates of asbestosis are compatible with mesothelioma rates, but asbestosis is thought to have different dose-response relationship with asbestos;
- •Using data from a combination of administrative sources is useful for surveillance of work-related diseases.
